The WTS Canadian Education Foundation, a volunteer-run registered Canadian charity, is committed to enhancing Canada's transportation industry through diversity. The **Arup Award for Advancing Women in Transportation** aims to support the growth of students in the transportation field by encouraging promising new professionals and students to pursue careers in transportation. This scholarship is open to enrolled post-secondary school students pursuing a degree in a planning, engineering, environmental or other related programs associated with the transportation industry. Students are eligible if they are currently enrolled at an accredited university in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area, Kitchener, Waterloo and Guelph.

Individual **\$3,000 (CAD)** scholarships will be awarded to one undergraduate or graduate student. Previous WTS Scholarship recipients are not eligible.

Selection of the scholarship recipients will be made in March/April 2025, and successful applicants will be announced at the WTS Annual Conference in May 2025. Attendance at the conference is encouraged but not mandatory. However, notice of the scholarships and award recipient names will be shared during the conference. Recipient names and photos will also appear in the **WTS Canadian Education Foundation** and the **WTS Toronto Area Chapter** publications.

2.	<p>Letter of Recommendation: (Max. 1 page)</p> <p>Attach one (1) letter of recommendation from a previous teacher, professor, employer or community leader (including Elder, mentor, or cultural teacher). The letter should address why you are a good candidate based on the noted scholarship criteria.</p>
3.	<p>Proof of Enrollment:</p> <p>Attach a copy of your tuition receipt or registration receipt.</p>
4.	<p>Transcripts:</p> <p>Attach a copy of your most recent transcript. If first year attach high school transcript.</p>
5.	<p>Other:</p> <p>Please indicate any other supporting documentation submitted with your application.</p>

Application Guide

1. **Review the scholarship requirements:** Before you start your application, make sure you understand the eligibility requirements for the WTS Canadian Education Foundation scholarship. The scholarship is open to anyone pursuing a degree or diploma in transportation or a related field, and applicants must be currently enrolled at an accredited university in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area, Kitchener, Waterloo and Guelph.
2. **Deadlines:** Ensure you submit by the submission deadlines, have included all required documents, and pay attention to any additional instructions or prompts.
3. **Understand the selection criteria:** The WTS Canadian Education Foundation scholarship is awarded based on your connection with the transportation industry and any related activities and interests, demonstrable interest in the promotion of the advancement of gender diversity within the transportation industry, leadership potential and good character with consideration for academic performance and work experience. When writing your Personal Statement, keep the criteria in mind and provide examples that demonstrate your qualifications.
 - 3.1. **Highlight Your Relevant Experiences:** Use the Personal Statement to discuss any transportation-related activities or interests you have pursued, such as research, internships or co-op positions, or volunteer work. The applicant should place greater emphasis on sharing their personal journey by demonstrating how their experience has made them come to appreciate the importance of promoting gender diversity in the transportation industry.
 - 3.2. **Showcase Your Leadership Skills:** The WTs Canadian Education Foundation scholarship values individuals with strong leadership potential. Highlight any leadership roles you have taken on, such as leading a team project or volunteering for a transportation-related organization. Explain how these experiences have developed your leadership skills and how they will contribute to the transportation industry.
 - 3.3. **Connect Your Experiences to Your Future Goals:** Your Personal Statement should explain how your experiences have prepared you for your future career goals. Discuss your long-term career aspirations and how you hope to contribute to the transportation industry. Explain how the scholarship will help you achieve these goals, and how you plan to leverage the scholarship to make a positive impact on the industry.
 - 3.4. **Emphasize Your Passion:** Lastly, make sure to emphasize your passion for transportation. Explain why transportation is important to you and how you hope to contribute to its growth and development. Your passion should shine through in your Personal Statement, making it clear to the scholarship committee why you are a strong candidate for the WTS Canadian Education Foundation scholarship
 - 3.5. **Edit and Revise:** Once you have drafted your Personal Statement, take the time to edit and revise it. Check for spelling and grammatical errors and ensure that your writing is clear and concise. Share your statement with a friend, family member, or mentor to get feedback and suggestions for improvement.
